Objectives

Students will:

- watch a historical black and white movie -- Charlie Chaplin's City Lights
- describe the antagonist and protagonists. describe the plot points in the story.
- Create their own 1:45 -- 3 minute black and white silent film.

Assignment

- 1. Create a silent, black and white movie that has a running time of around 1:45 -- 3 minutes.
- 2. You may choose to make a comedy or drama, as long as the story includes a conflict, resolution, and is creative.
- 3. Because the movie will be short, the conflict should be rather simple and clear. You must complete the following:
 - 1. Watch a short subject from the silent era of filmmaking. Charlie Chaplin *City Lights*.
 - 2. Discuss plot, character and sequences in making a black and silent film.

Your Film:

- 1. Each student must write a treatment for a film. The treatment will include:
 - a. Character and Plot describe each in a few sentences.
 - b. Treatment form Introduce character and obstacle.
 - c. Middle Situation 1, Situation 2, Situation 3(?)
 - d. End Resolution

2. Share your individual treatment with the group **and choose** one to recreate as a group.

3. Write one group treatment.

- 4. Create a storyboard.
- 5. After turning in your storyboard, create a shot list.
- 6. Use a variety of camera angles.
- 7. Make sure that your shots are long enough to be smoothly edited.

8. Concentrate on continuity of shots by: matching your wide, medium and close up shots.

- A. Film in areas where other classes won't be disturbed.
- B. Capture and import footage from SD card.
 - a. Lay down the video into timeline.
 - b. Cut by matching different frame sizes that smoothly create continuity.
 - c. Add room tone, music and titles.

Evaluation

You are expected to create a professional-quality video by using/achieving the following: • Make story interesting and easy to follow by:

- Making characters stand out.
- Using creative camera shots.
- Following action through edits and motivated camera movement.
- Creating and edit that includes smooth transitions and continuity of shots.
- Having good title cards to explain scenes if needed.
