- The film Bonnie and Clyde deals with the themes of violence, promiscuity, anti-establishment and disillusionment. Choose one of these themes and make a strong argument defending your stance. Use three strong points of interest.
- How does the film Bonnie and Clyde embrace or attack the views of feminism? Use three points of interest to defend your stance.
- How does Bonnie and Clyde change the views of the merging of violence and humor in films?
