CHILDREN'S REVIEWS

- Each group member will read three children's stories and create a strong review.
- The review assignment will contain the accepted MLA heading on the first page.
- Each review will contain a summary and an analysis section.
- Each review will have strong headings that are underlined and contain a colon at the end of the heading.
 - Each summary section will contain a word count of 150 words or more, title and author (i.e. <u>Summary (155)</u>: "The Flying Pigs" by Albert Brunch).
 - Each analysis section will include a word count of 200 words or more and a title (i.e. <u>Analysis (225)</u>: "The Flying Pigs").
- Each analysis section must focus on literary devices contained in the story that aids or distracts from the story line. You must avoid writing the review in the first person. Do not personalize by telling the audience why you liked or disliked the story. Instead, focus on the elements of the story that increase or decrease the effectiveness of the narrative.
- Focus on literary devices like tone, mood, writing structure, rhyme scheme, illustrations, colors, etc.
- Each summary and analysis section will be **SINGLE SPACED**, but you will double before and after each heading. Look at the example below.
