- How does the film <u>The Graduate</u> examine feelings of fear and self-doubt? Use three points of interest.
- <u>The Graduate</u> contains themes of loneliness, isolation and entrapment. Choose one of these themes and defend your stance by using three strong points of interest.
- Explain how <u>The Graduate</u> is a film that focuses on the coming of age theme. What three points help defend this theme?
- Free love is a strong theme in the 1960s. How does <u>The Graduate</u> either champion or attack this theme? Make sure you have three strong points of interest.
